Audience: Enhanced Production Audit Program (EPAP) users

Purpose: To remind AB and SK EPAP stakeholders of restrictions on

the use of theme conclusions when editing an EPAP

declaration.

Key Principles:

There are four options for theme conclusions: Acceptable, Deficient, Not Applicable, or Not Evaluated. These options have limitations on when they can and cannot be used.

If industry selects a theme conclusion which does not match AER/SER requirements, the EPAP declaration will be rejected and Industry will be required to revise, obtain the proper signatures, and resubmit the declaration.

The EPAP edit **AUD0085** restricts the use of "Not Applicable" and "Not Evaluated".

- Not Applicable is to be used when there are no facilities identified for a Theme, or if all listed facilities have been reported as not applicable.
- <u>Not Evaluated</u> is to be used when controls exist for one or more applicable facilities, but an evaluation did not occur, or controls do not exist.



TIP

The EPAP edit AUD0064 restricts the use of "Acceptable" and "Deficient".

Acceptable or Deficient are only to be used if one or more applicable facilities have controls which have been evaluated for the theme.
